The Highbanks Trail System is a scenic back-country linear trail system with views of the Au Sable River Valley. From the high bluffs of the south shore of the Au Sable River, many species of plants, animals and songbirds may be viewed in their natural setting. The Highbanks Trail System is located in Iosco County, Michigan. The nearest communities are Tawas and East Tawas, about 12 miles southeast; Oscoda, about 15 miles east; and Hale, about 15 miles west.

ACCESS


