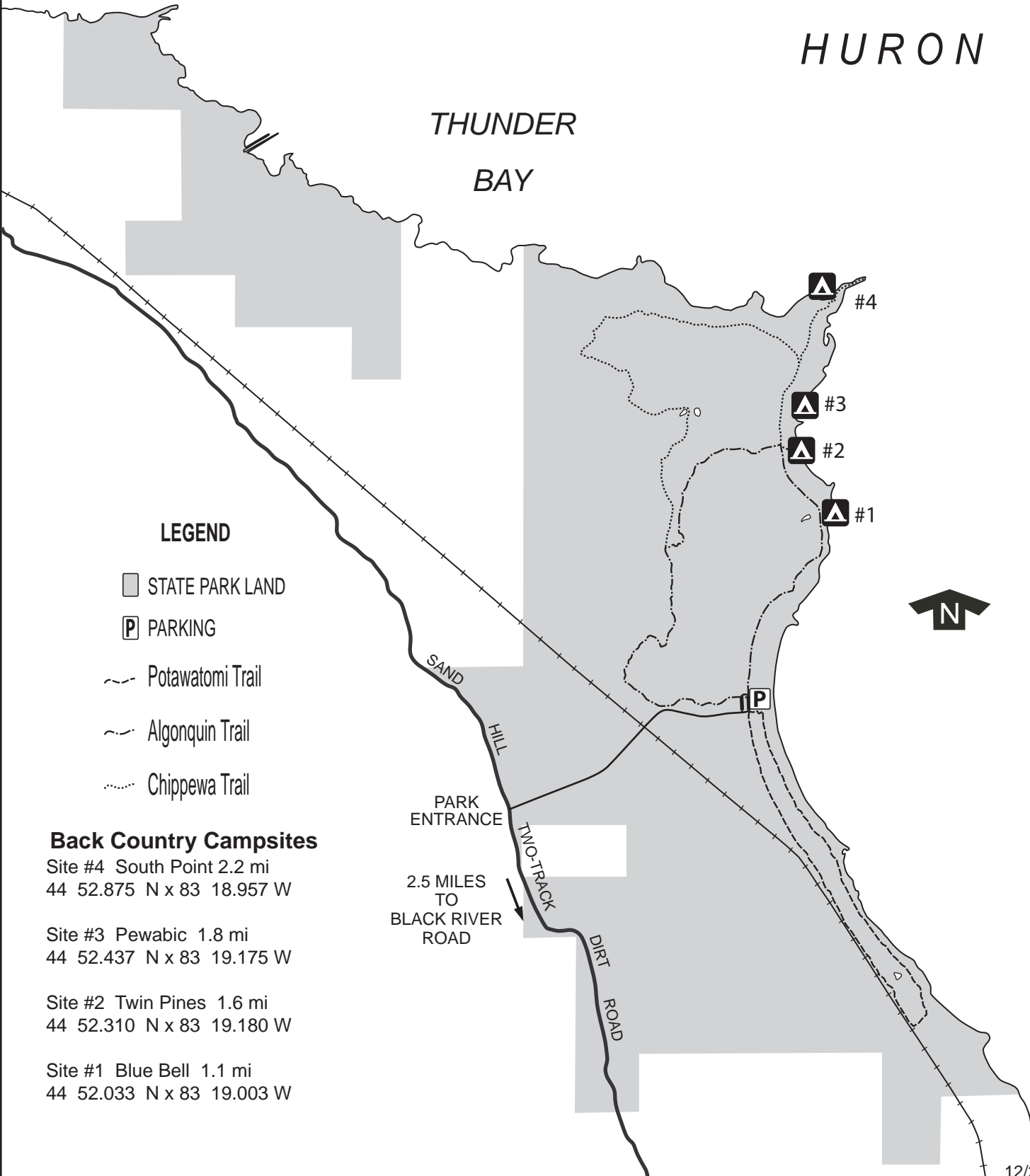

Chief Negwegon

Negwegon was a famous Chippewa Chief who lived in the Mackinaw area of Michigan's northern lower peninsula in the late 1700s.

Hazlett Kramer



Hazlett Kramer is credited for encouraging the State of Michigan to change the name of Alpena State Park to Negwegon State Park, in honor of Chief Negwegon. Kramer lived in Alpena and was a life long advocate for Native Americans.

Things to do



Hiking

The old stagecoach trail provides a great surface for hiking. There are 12 miles of marked hiking trails throughout the park.



Hunting

Negwegon State Park is open to hunting. Both large and small game can be found, including white-tailed deer, rabbit and grouse. Stay safe and wear orange during hunting season!



Paddling

The Lake Huron shoreline is a popular location for kayaking and canoeing. Negwegon has over nine miles of wild shoreline to explore.



Swimming

Looking for a place to cool off? Or a nice spot to relax? Grab a swimsuit and towel and head for the beach.



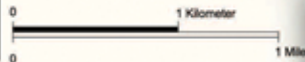
Wildlife Viewing

Michigan State Parks are great places to view wildlife, and Negwegon is no exception. The Lake Huron shoreline features a cobble beach, which is a nesting requirement for many shorebirds including plovers and terns.



Backcountry Camping

There are four backcountry campsites within the park. Campsites are located near the Lake Huron shoreline and are equipped with a picnic table, bear pole andouthouse. Campers are asked to reserve a site by calling Harrisville State Park at (989) 734-5126.
